**Dear Parents of a 20 – 36 Month Old,**

Our fall Early Explorers class will meet for eight sessions beginning September 17, 2011. This will be an opportunity for children 20-36 months old and their parents/guardians to participate together in planned activities. These will include rhythm activities, storytime, large motor experiences, sensory experiences, and manipulative projects. The children will also, with parent and teacher guidance, learn to play with other children.

**Detailed information on these exciting classes is as follows:**

- Dates:** Saturday mornings 9:30-11:00 a.m. **September 17 – November 19, 2011**  
(no class on October 8 and November 12)
- Location:** AAUW Nursery School, 2500 Northern Ave., Waukegan, IL 60087
- Fee:** \$80.00 for eight sessions. There is a one-time registration fee of \$15.00 per family per school year.
- Age:** The child must be at least 20 months old when the fall session begins.
- Class Size:** 14 children and 14 parents (YOUNGER AND OLDER SIBLINGS DO NOT ATTEND THESE SESSIONS)
- Parents:** Parent or guardian (or another adult family member) must attend sessions with the child.
- Health Form:** We must have a completed Health History form for each child. Each attending parent must have had a TB test within the past 12 months. Only adults with a negative TB test on file at school can attend these sessions.
- Registration:** Applications and Health History forms are available at school. Applications should be filled in and returned to the school as soon as possible.

This class will be open to anyone who is interested in it and will be filled on a first come, first served basis.
